Notice is hereby given that NLEI Ltd, (company number SC511747 at registered address Clyde View (Suite F3), Riverside Business Park, 22 Pottery Street, Greenock, PA15 2UZ), has applied to the Scottish Ministers for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate a wind farm on land at Queensberry Estate, approximately 5km south of Crawfordjohn, 2km northeast of Sanquhar and west of Wanlockhead in Dumfries and Galloway (Central Grid Reference 283464, 615138) and for a direction under Section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 that planning permission for the development be deemed to be granted. The installed capacity of the proposed generating station as amended would have a generating capacity of greater than 50 megawatts (MW) ( around 147 MW) comprising 30 turbines with a ground to blade tip height of 149 metres. The proposal is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment.

NLEI Ltd has now submitted additional information to Scottish Ministers, which includes information relating to the changes to the predicted impacts of the proposal as a result of the deletion of five turbines and associated infrastructure and amendment to the Development Area. This includes updated assessments for landscape and visual, ecology, ornithology, hydrology, peat slide risk, historic environment and noise effects, along with information provided to consultees during consultation on the Section 36 ES.
